BACKGROUND INFO:

Agent Hawkeye was born Daniel Webb, Sept 28, 1980. A native of London, England, Daniel enlisted in the Army in 1997, mainly to get out of his middle-class neighborhood in London's East End. Daniel's father is a government employee working for the Ministry of Transportation, his mother a homemaker raising the family's five children. After Basic Training Daniel passed selection to join the 3rd Para Regiment where his excellent marksmanship skills landed him a position as a scout/sniper in the regiment's Reconnaissance, Surveillance, and Target Acquisition or RSTA. His unit served in the UN mission in Bosnia Herzegovina before returning to the UK in the summer of 2001. Daniel's enlistment was scheduled to expire on September 28, 2001. He re-enlisted after the terrorist attacks on the United States and, newly promoted to Sergeant, Webb was sent with other RSTA personnel of 3rd Para to Kuwait. Daniel was deployed from Kuwait to Bagram airbase in Afghanistan after the fall of the Taliban in late 2001. In 2002 his unit participated in support of British and Afghan militia forces operating in southern Afghanistan.

Sgt. Webb was awarded the Military Cross after a mission where he provided direct weapons fire and directed air support attacks against 400-500 Taliban soldiers who had surrounded an Afghan army company in a remote mountain pass. His team was inserted onto a hilltop overlooking the besieged company where Webb directed airstrikes that killed 75-100 men; forcing the Taliban to lift the siege around the Afghan soldiers. When their position was compromised and attacked Sgt Webb was credited with personally killing eleven attacking Taliban while waiting to be evacuated by helicopter. Daniel's unit was re-deployed from Afghanistan to Maysan Province Iraq in 2003, where he provided counter-sniper support to British Army troops operating between Basra and the Iranian border. Daniel Webb decided to not re-enlist and left the Army in the fall of 2005 but his service record caught the attention of Agency recruiter Agent Scotch.
