BACKGROUND INFO:

Born in remote section of northwest Montana and raised by father. Mother's history unknown. Grew up in foster care after father's death at the age of seven. Attended the University of Montana and graduated with a Bachelors degree in Archeology.

Criminal background record: Five minor offenses charged by the U.S. State Department - Bureau of Educational And Cultural Affairs: International Cultural Property Protection Division regarding the smuggling of foreign archaeological items ranging from ornate statues, vessels to an elaborate carved human skull and tortoise shell, removed from Central and South America and smuggled into U.S. via Nogales, AZ, Dennis DeConcini Port of Entry. Charged with felony, Rodeo was convicted of smuggling Aung San Suu Kyi, the daughter of the first Burmese Prime Minister, General Aung San, out of Burma (Myanmar) and into the U.S. Consulate General's office in Krakow, Poland, in an effort to reach the "Community of Democracies," which was meeting in Warsaw, Poland that week. Aung San Suu Kyi made a plea for international help in restoring democracy in Burma after a government attack on a student-organized opposition protest resulted in over 1000 civilian fatalities. The Agency is under the suspicion that Rodeo has been involved in several burglaries, as is also the U.S. Department of The Interior - Bureau of Reclamation on January 21, 2001 from the Utah State Museum and March 13, 2002, Museum of America's Freedom Trains.
