BACKGROUND INFO:

Albert Hirsch, Agent Scotch, is a faceman used by The Agency to recruit new agents. In the past he has focused on identifying Explorers, Scouts and Soldiers who would be successful in the organization. Hirsch followed Randolph Wingate to The Agency back in the early years. Agent Scotch has been working to develop new agents most of his adult life.

Scotch's actual age and background prior to The Agency are highly classified, but it is commonly believed that Scotch began in the espionage business while the French were still running Vietnam. He has been around too long to care about patriotism, politics or many other issues. His allegiance is to the mission; finding people who can get things done, and finding them before the opposition does.

Using the aliases Aaron Parker, Gabriel Fox, Henri' Godard, and Johann Kessler, Agent Scotch travels the world playing the role of corporate troubleshooter, jaded playboy, or medical missionary, depending on whatever cover is required. He's been around enough to bluff his way through most any situation; a talent that has saved his life on more than one occasion. His background and field experiences have given Agent Scotch an uncanny ability to identify persons who have the skills and temperament to make excellent field agents. Scotch rarely looks for new talent within the national intelligence agencies, he prefers to find agents in other walks of life - individuals who have not been jaded or developed bad habits working for organizations like the CIA, Mossad or KGB.

Although they began in the business together, it is not clear what if any personal loyalty Hirsch has to Randolph Wingate. The two have not worked together directly, or been observed communicating outside of routine Agency interactions, for a dozen years.
