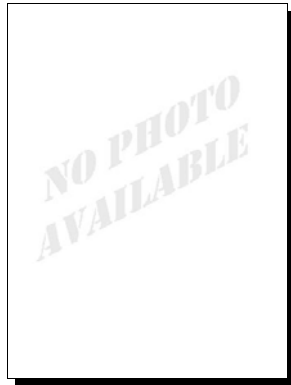

MISSION BRIEFING:

A secret Agency facility in Alaska, located about 120 miles north of Fairbanks, appears to be in trouble. The International Communications Encoding and Masking Analysis Network (ICEMAN) station was preparing for a large blizzard when communication was lost. Satellite imaging tracked the storm's passing, but no communication has been reestablished and the facility appears powered down. Your mission is to head to the ICEMAN station and find out what happened. If the facility is crippled beyond repair, you will need to extract the main computer's memory core along with any surviving station staff members. Forecasts say that more bad weather could be on the way, so don't be long. Be advised, the facility is state of the art and a simple storm should not have crippled it so easily. This could be a well-timed attack by some outside force. Be on your guard.

Enclosed with your gear is an extraction drive, with memory capable of storing the facilities main database. The Agency is also issuing you an HH-60G Pave Hawk helicopter and crew for this mission. They will be waiting at Eielson Air Force Base outside of Fairbanks. Your flight leaves in 1 hour. Good luck.

MISSION DEBRIEFING:

Mission Complete 3-10-07 5:00PM. Team received order and proceeded to Fairbanks, AK. Upon arrival at Eilson Air Force Base, they dismissed all but one of the helicopter crew assigned to them, leaving only the gunner. Agents lifted off aware of a secondary blizzard, and arrived at the ICEMAN station under heavy snowfall conditions. The facility was completely powered down, and one of the emergency snowmobiles was missing from the storage shed. Team opened the main facility door and proceeded inside, finding a powered down station and four of the six-man crew inside the medical bay. Questioning revealed that the missing crew was Danielle Grams and Simon Drexon, who had apparently gone for help some time earlier. Later, a particularly brutal interrogation revealed that Drexon was responsible for the backup generator. Several methods were used to try and access the main computer core room, a heavy blowtorch, power splicing the access panel, and even use of the Pave Hawk's 25mm heavy machine gun were attempted. In the end however, it was diligent work on the backup generator that eventually worked. Further evidence of tampering was discovered, but core was extracted successfully. A command decision was made to abandon the facility, and the Agents did their best to render the station's technology useless before departing. Due greatly to piloting skills, the team returned safely to Eilson AFB, with all other surviving station members and the extracted core memory. Agents immediately reported the security breach and new protocols are in place at all Agency facilities. Despite their warning, however, one other Agency station in Greenland was compromised. Exact losses are still unknown. It is the Agency's belief this was a well-planned breach in security by Drexon.
