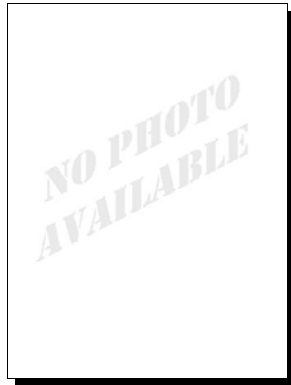

MISSION BRIEFING:

Agent Iris was assigned to monitor Dominic Romano in connection with illegal narcotics. She turned up dead three days later and was ruled an accident by authorities, but the Agency believes foul play was involved. Before her death, she contacted the Agency to report that she had the microfilm evidence, but was under the suspicion that her cover might have been compromised. She left immediately, in a stolen vehicle owned by Mr. Romano, but never made it back. The Agency is led to believe that she might have secretly hidden the microfilm in the stolen vehicle. The vehicle was sold to a Las Vegas casino owner and is now the grand prize, to be awarded to the top player, in the 46th "Grimaldi Dynasty Challenge" poker tournament, held at the Monte Carlo Casino, in Las Vegas, NV. Your mission is to retrieve the microfilm from the vehicle located in the Monte Carlo Casino. The Agency is borrowing each Agent \$15,000 to enter themselves into the poker tournament in hopes of winning the vehicle without any suspicions being aroused. \$10,000 is for the entrance fee and \$5,000 is the starting limit in the tournament. Use any means necessary to retrieve the microfilm if no member of your team is capable of winning the vehicle in the tournament. Your flight to McCarran airport leaves in ten minutes.

MISSION DEBRIEFING:

Mission completed 3:45 pm on 7/3/2006. Agents flew to Las Vegas, NV and registered for the poker tournament at the Monte Carlo Casino. Guided by Agent Sliver, Agents spent time during the 1st night doing reconnaissance at various locations on the Vegas strip in hopes of gathering more Intel into the poker tournament. The next day, Agents were seated at different tables during the first round of tournament play where they defeated their opponents, winning the \$30,000 chip mark, and moving onto the second round that night. Agents were seated at different tables again at the start of the second round, where they recognized Dominic Romano, seated at one of the 2 remaining tables. The Monte Carlo Casino gambling commissioning board raised the sanctioned \$1,000 maximum bet to \$2,500 in hopes of a more competitive game, which the Agents took full advantage of and won very decisively to move onto the final round the following day. Agents entered the third round, playing against each other, along with Dominic Romano and another poker professional. Many types of play were used in the "No Limit" final round as Agent WhiteWolf bluffed her way into deceiving everyone at the table to go all-in, in which a single hand was going to decide the winner of the tournament. Agent WhiteWolf was victorious and was awarded a substantial sum of money, in which she has relinquished the majority of it to the Agency, to be used to fund various fields of study in the Agency's Research & Development department. She was also awarded the "Grimaldi Dynasty Challenge" Ferrari Enzo along with the hidden microfilm. The Agency has opted to let her keep the vehicle as a personal memento of the completed mission after turning in the microfilm evidence. Agents engaged in a heated discussion with Dominic Romano, who was willing to buy the vehicle for 3 times the blue-book value, but was thwarted in any attempts of regaining it or the microfilm back. Agents overheard Mr. Romano talking about the suspected murder of Agent Iris and his suspected narcotics dealings and conveyed this info to the Agency, where his telephone was tapped and he was arrested on 15 counts of illegal narcotics possession and fabrication and now with proof to back it up.
