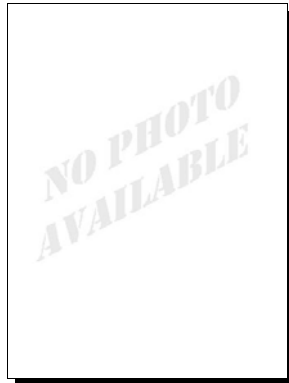

MISSION BRIEFING:

Simon Drexon, a former NSA operative, has been spotted at the first two NHL championship hockey games in Carolina. The Agency believes he will attend the third game of the series tomorrow night in Edmonton, Canada. Drexon is a high-priority fugitive throughout the world and has not been seen in public for several years, so this is a rare opportunity. MISSION DEBRIEFING:
