ORGANIZATION BACKGROUND: _____

The Peruvian leftist rebel brigade was organized in 1994 by a small band of Peruvian ex-military and guerilla soldiers. Was responsible for several small riots and altercations from 1995 to 1997 over alleged crimes of political governmental corruption. No known leader was established until 1998 when Fernando Sanchez, aka Black Boa, gave a warning message of upcoming attacks against the Peruvian government, which was broadcast on local news channels around the country. The Black Boa claims responsibility for many later attacks and raids on political figures and facilities, which unfortunately spilled over into civilian territories that were categorized as collateral damage. In 2001, the organization implemented a gruesome suicide bombing on a government internal affairs facility, which also housed a child daycare center, killing over fifty children and wounding hundreds more. The Peruvian populous are very susceptible to the threats and fear that the Black Boa instills, so in-depth information is limited. The exact location of their operation is unknown, except that it exists and operates somewhere within the Amazon Basin. The number of rebels are estimated anywhere from fifty to two-hundred with a handful of squad leaders, including Pedro Sanchez, brother to Fernando Sanchez, leading small bands of guerilla soldiers on calculated strikes. It is not known how defended or fortified the organization is, but is suspected to possess small arms fire along with automatic assault rifles. The Black Boa is still in operation as of today and is a constant threat to the country.
